An affirmation of this, is the recognition awarded to the college by NAAC with an “A++” grade. Previously, in 2016, the college had been assessed as an “A” grade institute by the NAAC team. The journey from A to A++ has been a fulfilling and enriching experience. During this tenure, the college has augmented itself in all facets, comprising state of the art infrastructure, student support, career advancement, faculty enrichment and community outreach, to name a few.

Continuous expansion of infrastructure of the college has played a pivotal role in this journey. Topping the list of infrastructural changes is the addition of Mata Sahib Kaur Girls Hostel for the ever-

growing number of outstation female students. Some other key infrastructural additions include the development of a fourth computer lab, a shooting range of international standards, research cubicles for faculty members, solar panels, a renovated parking lot and Principal office; an additional floor on one of the teaching block along with modernization of existing conference room, seminar room and mini-auditorium. Interested students are also given an opportunity to enroll in certificate courses for foreign languages (French, German & Japanese). 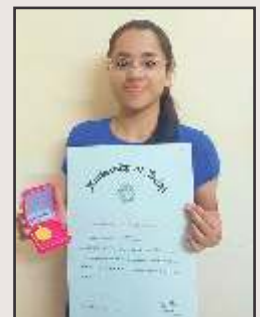

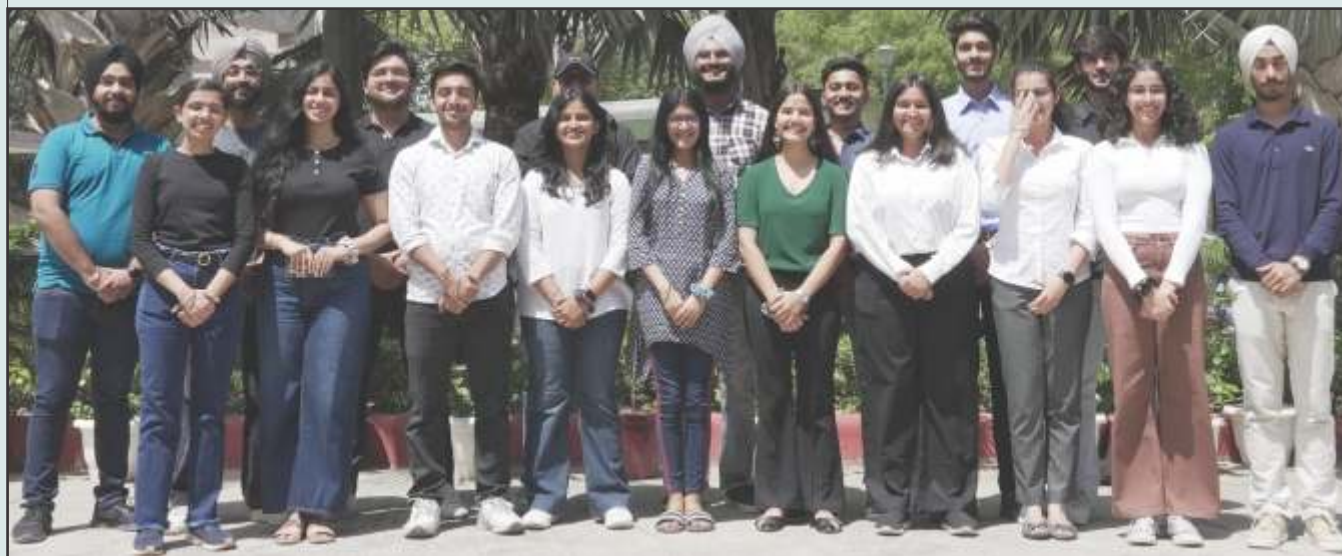

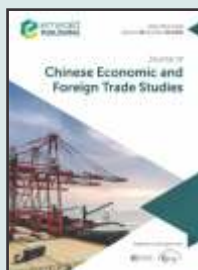

## Seminar Committee

Seminar Committee organised Vimarsh 2023 – the 6<sup>th</sup> Biennial International Convention on the theme “India on the Path to Sustainable and Inclusive Development: Myth or Reality” on 24 March, 2023 at Hotel Le Méridien, Delhi. The inaugural session was initiated by Prof. Kawal Gill, Convener, who introduced the concept note of the program by establishing the interrelationship between inclusive development and sustainable development. Chief Guest for the convention, Dr. Han Ulaş Demirag, Country Director, Head of South Hub, International Fund for Agricultural Development, shared his experience of working with the remote communities in India in Orissa, Madhya Pradesh and Uttarakhand. Prof. Balaram Pani, Dean of Colleges, University of Delhi, affirmed his faith in the young bright minds that they will work towards deleterious



actions to be taken to forestall mindless growth. Mr. Amitabh Behar, CEO, Oxfam India, added the dimensions of gender and labor inclusivity to the economic criteria which remains the focal point of policy decisions. Mr. Jan Drbohlav, COO, Volkswagen Group Technology Solutions India, brought the industry perspective to the ongoing discussion and demonstrated how his company was endeavoring to achieve the target of net zero by switching to energy efficient fuels.

## Centre of Excellence

Eight project proposals were accepted and a subsequent review of the progress of the accepted projects was organised on 17 February, 2023.

Two Workshops on Qualitative Research Methods were organised on 16 September, 2022 and 22 September, 2022 respectively in collaboration with IQAC of the college. Prof. Hemandra Dangi, Department of Commerce, University of Delhi was the resource person for both the sessions. He helped acquaint the faculty with the software NVIVO in the first session and extensively discussed Bibliometric Analysis in the latter session. 25 faculty members attended the sessions.

The Centre in collaboration with the Department of Business Economics and Management Studies organised a Three-Session Workshop on *Basic Research Workshop – A Practical Approach using SPSS* on 21, 24 and 27 February 2023. Dr Meenu Chopra, Assistant Professor, Department of Business Economics and Management Studies, the resource person for the workshop, introduced the students to the nuances of the research process.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, a flagship program of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, is inspired by the vision of transformational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge institutions to help build the architecture of an inclusive India. The mission of the program is to enable higher educational institutions to work with the people of rural India in identifying developmental challenges and evolving appropriate solutions for accelerating sustainable growth. During the year three drives were conducted in villages namely- Karala, Khedakhurd and Pootkhurd under this initiative.



The drive at Karala village was based on waste segregation and career counseling. Unnat Bharat Abhiyan team from SGGSCC went on a field visit to Sarvodaya Kanya Vidyalaya, on 6 February, 2023. The team conducted a career counseling session for the girls studying in class 12. They also discussed new reforms in the education system, skill upgradation and the various career options after class 12. The team also guided them the correct way of waste disposal and distributed green and red color dustbins to distinguish between dry and wet waste. The drive at Khedakhurd aimed at imparting knowledge on cleanliness and waste segregation.

It was conducted on 11 November, 2022. More than 100 families participated in this drive to learn how to segregate wastes. A survey was also conducted which intended at gaining an overview of major problems in the village and thereafter devising solutions for the same. The last drive at Pootkhurd was based on plantation and career counseling themes. A Sapling Distribution Drive was organized in which 100 plants were distributed to the families of Pootkhurd village. Awareness regarding career options and different opportunities was discussed.

On 21





September, the Club organized its Annual Blood Donation Camp where it collected 202 units of blood. A drive to Autism Boys Hostel (1 October), visit to Kamla Bakshi Old Age Home to celebrate Diwali and a Dengue Awareness Workshop at Spreading Smiles Gyaan Kendra were organized in the month of October. Food Donation Drive, Children's Day visit to Raen Basera and "Commit to Quit" – a Cigarette Butt Collection Drive were also taken up in the month of November. One of the major initiatives in this tenure is Project Udaan – a weekly initiative to educate slum children near Gopal Mandir, Pitampura.

In December, a visit to Sir Sobha Singh Dharamshala – a cancer care treatment center, Pawtect – The Radium Band Drive (17 December) and a Christmas visit on 25 December to Deepti Ashram were organized. The Club hosted its annual socio-cultural fest: Consortium on 18 February, 2023 at Pacific Mall, Netaji Subhash Place. Few noted speakers were Mr. Evan Luthra, Captain Shivani Luthra, Mr. Harteerath Singh, RJ Naved. Some online awareness campaigns conducted during the year were Abortion Laws Campaign, Suicide Prevention Awareness, Awareness of Monkey Pox, Maternal Healthcare and Sex Education Campaign.

Enactus team has won several awards during the year for its projects such as the Enactus National Competition 2022, Enactus Race to Rethink Plastic 2022 and was among the top 16 finalists in the Enactus World Cup 2022. The club won the best impact award in Enactus 77 Second Film Festival and achieved success by holding positions in many business plan competitions including second position at Model Shark Tank and at C.O.D.E.; first position Enactus Shivaji Business Plan competition and second position at Enactus St. Stephens Business Plan Competition.
