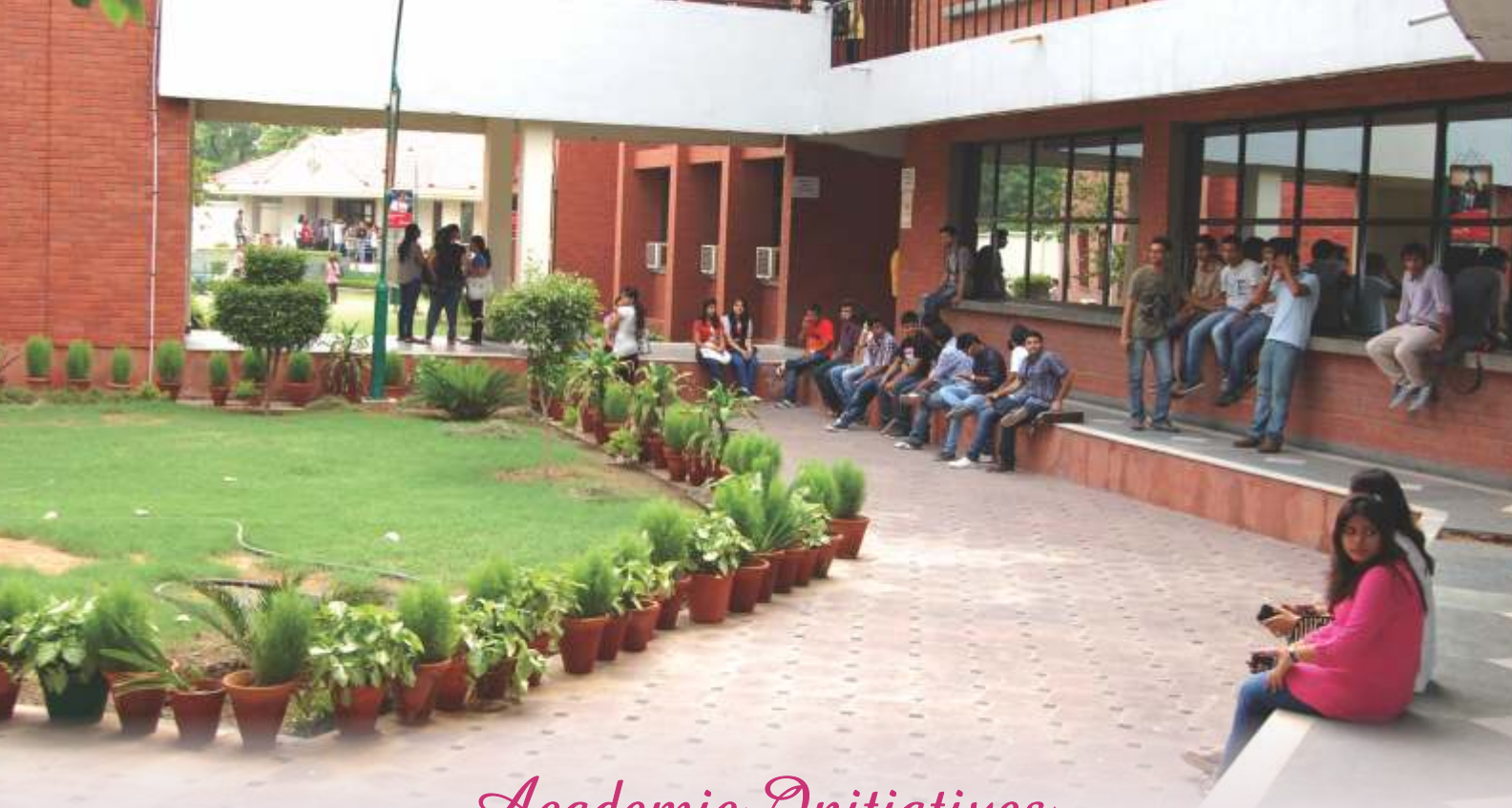


### *PG Diploma in International Marketing*

## *Academic Initiatives*

### *IQAC - Internal Quality Assurance Cell*

The major objectives of IQAC are a) Empowering faculty, b) Students , c) Support staff and d) Improving infrastructure in the college while documenting various programmes and activities for overall improvement of the quality of teaching-learning in the college. It acts as a nodal agency of the institution for coordination of quality related activities, comprising of implementation of best practices; offering better job opportunities and guidance through placement/internship offers, industry interface, faculty development and student training. The digitization of all administrative processes is one illustration of such a practice. The student friendly smart prof application has been adopted by the college for internal assessment and attendance of students, which displays real time data for all the users. IQAC is consistently seeking to implement a quality culture in the college. The faculty development workshops, lecture series for students and coordination of forty plus clubs and student societies is undertaken by IQAC team.

Every year Annual Quality Assurance Report is submitted by IQAC to NAAC as per the parameters. This year, we applied for second cycle of NAAC accreditation and got the best **grade A++** for our college. Apart from that, we continuously strive for excellence through facilitating the creation of a learner-centric environment conducive to quality education and faculty maturation to adopt the required knowledge and technology for participatory teaching and learning process; arrange for feedback response from students, parents and other stakeholders on quality-related institutional processes; and set up an information center for dissemination of information on various quality parameters of higher education.

IQAC organizes several FDPs and conferences, seminars on quality related issues, implementation of New Education Policy (NEP), and research methodology for students and faculty. The college has set up two centers for improvement in the same, i.e. COE and CPD. A database Capital Line Prowess was subscribed for annual usage in order to facilitate research and teaching learning process in the department of Commerce and Economics. Library RFID and online resources were made available to students and faculty. The online resources were shared with students through google classrooms by faculty members as well. As the campus reopened, covid protocol was implemented on the campus, such as checking thermal screening at the gate, mask wearing, hand sanitizer dispensers installed at many places. The infrastructure is continuously upgraded. The new Ampitheatre has been renovated with latest Air conditioners, sound system, and projector. The old seminar room and conference rooms have been refurnished and all ICT facilities have been incorporated. The auditorium is under renovation and repair too, so that facilities for co-curricular activities can improve. The air conditioning of class room block has been



completed. The college has signed a MOU for solar energy installation at Narela village for upgrading our electricity needs by 700 KV solar powerfield.

IQAC and the college administration facilitated the promotions of teaching and non-teaching staff last year. Five teachers were promoted as Professors and eleven as Associate professors after proper selection committee interviews. Thus, IQAC team is persistently guiding and inspiring faculty to publish quality research articles in reputed journals. We are also trying to improve our NIRF ranking, in 2023, the college was ranked at 47 on all India basis.

### *BSE-SCJSCC- Centre of Excellence*

With the objective to motivate, guide and help understand the various aspects of research for research-aspiring faculty members and college students, Centre of Excellence (COE) was set up the in May, 2019. The Centre continuously organises Faculty Development Programmes, Lecture Series, workshops/training sessions for teachers and students with competent resource persons from both within and outside the country.

To promote and facilitate research in different areas and also to bring together faculty members and students from different disciplines, Centre gives liberal grants to undertake innovative projects that address real world challenges and/or enhance community outreach. Further, to encourage good quality research work, Centre awards faculty members whose manuscripts are published in any Scopus or Web of Science listed journal, with Rs.10,000 per publication.

### *SCJSCC- Centre for Professional Development*

The centre aims at imparting competencies and fulfilling career aspirations of students through structured learning pathways i.e. offering add-on courses (Short term certificate/diploma courses), conducting training sessions/workshops, holding special lectures, etc. The centre promotes networking with national & international institutions of repute and collaborates with industry and academia for developing the curriculum and delivery of appropriate skills for students in tandem with the emerging needs of the society. Students are trained and updated by the professionals and also get an opportunity for experimental learning.

### **B.Com. (Honours)**

B.Com. (Hons.) program of the University of Delhi is designed to enable and empower students to acquire knowledge, skills and abilities to analyse and synthesize the contemporary realities pertaining to the business. This course provides for maintaining and sustaining existing businesses in the face of the winds of change and competition and a desperately needed perspective of sustainable growth. This program aims to instill conceptual understanding to equip students to deal with today's business realities and prepare them to drive and face the challenge of tomorrow. It also exposes the students to the world of technology and digitization in the relevant field as envisaged by scholars and policymakers. As mandated by the Government of India, this course is designed to help cultivate an entrepreneurial mindset and skills.

### *Program Specific Eligibility*

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

**Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which at least one should be from List B1**

OR

**Combination II: Any one Language from List A + Accountancy/Book Keeping + Any two subjects out of which at least one should be from List B1**

**Merit will be based on the best CUET scores obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.**

### **B.Com.**

Commerce is visualised as a link between society and business. The nature and purpose of interaction between both have undergone tremendous change with time. Information technology has re-modelled the shape and design of the business, engendering the metamorphosis of its very nature and the matrix of societal functioning. Recognising the implications of this change, the B.Com. Program aims at building in students an understanding of the functioning and premise of the business world. To achieve this, the program offers an opportunity for students to know different aspects of organizational functioning, financial systems, understanding of the economy, laws governing business, strategies adopted by businesses to reach society, etc. The program also provides the students an opportunity to explore, experiment and equip themselves to serve society not as employment seekers but as entrepreneurs and job creators.

### *Program Specific Eligibility*

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

**Combination I: Any one Language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2**

OR

Combination II: Any one Language from List A + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2 + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)

Merit will be based on the best CUET scores obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.

**Note:** As the weightage of the CUET Sections is not the same, appropriate proration will be done.

## B.A. (Honours) Economics

The B.A. (Hons.) Economics curriculum offers a rigorous basis for much of the advanced thinking in the Economics discipline. It provides the student with a logical paradigm for conceptualising and interpreting the behaviour and interactions of households, firms, and government institutions. The curriculum allows students to choose elective courses from a set of courses with contemporary relevance, thereby offering students the flexibility to prepare for careers in academia, law, management, journalism, government, and many other fields. The programme is consistent with global standards in the Economics discipline. It offers training comparable to that of an undergraduate student at the world's best universities.

### *Program Specific Eligibility*

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

**Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which one should be from List B1**

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

## B.Sc. (Honours) Computer Science

The B.Sc. (Hons.) Computer Science curriculum offers to develop theoretical foundations in computer science to build computational thinking, analytical, and problem-solving skills. The program prepares the students for higher studies in Computer Science and its applications. The course aims to produce skilled graduates with a creative mindset who can recognize a computational problem either in IT industry or society and develop effective solutions. In addition, the students develop expertise in programming skills using contemporary programming languages used by the software industry. It covers core computer science topics like computer systems architecture, data structures, computer networks, operating systems, computer graphics, algorithms, software engineering, database management, theory of computation, artificial intelligence, and information security.

### *Program Specific Eligibility*

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

**Any one language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + Any two subjects out of which one should be from List B1**

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.

## B.A. (Honours) Business Economics (BBE)

The B.A (Hons.) Business Economics program is a perfect blend of practical, analytical and theoretical tools to imbibe proficient capabilities in students to analyse data and information for sound policy formulation and decision making. Business Economics is essentially an application-based inter-disciplinary approach to tackling



business problems. The academic orientation of the course has been designed to create a strong orientation towards the seamless applicability of economics and related tools in the various functions of a business enterprise. The course equips students with tools and principles relating to subjects such as Statistics, Finance, Marketing, Economics, Econometrics with relevant software to keep abreast with the changing economic scenario and globalisation of business.

### *Program Specific Eligibility*

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

**Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)**

**Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.**

## **Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS)**

Bachelor of Management Studies or BMS is an undergraduate program for management studies. The course allows students to obtain the knowledge and skills needed to assume management positions in a wide range of organizations. The management Studies program provides students with a solid foundation in the field of management and strategy designing. The electives allow students to develop deeper knowledge in specific areas of interest – finance, marketing, human resource management and management of the global business. In addition to the business management course, it will equip students to understand how organizations work, how they are managed and sensitize students towards national and international environments. Students centred learning focuses on skills and practices that enable lifelong learning and independent problem-solving.

### *Program Specific Eligibility*

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

**Any one Language from List A + Mathematics/Applied Mathematics + SECTION III of CUET (General Test)**

**Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects.**





## B.A. (Honours) Punjabi

This program is designed to inculcate and equip the students with three major components: Punjabi language, literature, and culture since all these are impregnated in our secular heritage. The student get the opportunity to understand the functional aspect of the language through spoken language symposiums and interpretation sessions.

### *Program Specific Eligibility*

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

**Combination I: Punjabi from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from List B1 or List B2**

**OR**

**Combination II: Any one language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject either from List B1 or List B2**

Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above-mentioned combinations of subjects.

Candidates who opted for Combination II for admission will be considered only if seats remain vacant after considering all the candidates who opted for Combination I.

### **Generic Elective/Value Added Course/ Skill Enhancement Course/Ability Enhancement Course**

Information regarding the above mentioned courses will be made available on the college website. Students are instructed to kindly go through the details of the relevant curriculum (Complete syllabus and PPTs) and carefully fill up their respective options.

**Note: No change of option regarding Generic Elective/Value Added Course/Skill Enhancement Course/Ability Enhancement Course will be made once the form has been duly filled.**

## Post-Graduate Courses

M. ## Academic Resources & Infrastructural Facilities

### Library

The college library is housed in a multi-storied, centrally air-conditioned wing. It has modern facilities such as microfilming section, reprographics section, a small computer center, an audio visual room etc. The library is well equipped with latest ICT tools and equipments to collect, store, retrieve and disseminate the information to the faculty and the students. Being well-stocked the present collection consists of more than 51,000 books, 490 bound volumes of important journals and about 800 CDs. We have a rich collection of books on Commerce, Economics, Mathematics, Computer Science, Management and Sikhism. The library regularly subscribes to about 27 newspapers, 50 journals and magazines (Indian as well as International) on a variety of subjects.

The college library acquired NETLIB library software in 2001. The database of the books has been created. Some of the library facilities such as cataloging, CAS, OPAC search has already been computerized. The library has online public access catalogue through a web browser. The library books can be searched through internet on college website [www.sggsc.com/library](http://www.sggsc.com/library) or through web OPAC link <http://sggscclibrary.saraswatilib.com>. Entire database of the books can be searched through author, title, subject, etc. Patrons can view their transactions in the 'My account tab' of the window OPAC. User ID and password is the roll number of the student.

All the major activities of the library are computerized by using well-enabled, multiuser software system NETLIB shifting to open source software KOHA for providing

efficient and effective library services. The user may access their library account and search the OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) from anywhere, anytime through cell phone, laptop, desktop etc.

### Classrooms

Our college has spacious, well-lit and well-ventilated audio-visual classrooms. There is a power back-up facility in case of power breaks down to make sure teaching is not affected by the same.

### Computer Labs

The college hosts three ultra modern, centrally air-conditioned and well-furnished fully equipped computer labs to cater to the needs of Computer Science, Commerce and Economics students. It has two servers for Windows-NT and Linux multi-user operating systems each with 31 PC nodes equipped with Multimedia kits and interfaces to inkjet printers, laser printers and a scanner. The labs provide the internet facility accessible on each node.

The software profile includes the licensed versions of the latest packages viz., visual studio (Visual basic, Visual C++, Visual FoxPro), Jbuilder, Oracle, Tally, Dbase etc. as also the language compilers, viz, Turbo C++, Java Qbasic etc. We have established one electronic laboratory for B.Sc. (Computer Science) Students having 12 digital training kits for electronic practicals. We have added 40 more advanced systems to fulfill the needs of the college students.





## Workshops and Lectures

It is important to mention that all the departments are very active and regular in organising several workshops, trainings and lectures. These activities are organised on relevant topics and experts in the respected areas are invited to enlighten the students. Topics of contemporary importance are chosen to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real world scenario.

## 6<sup>th</sup> Biennial International Convention

The college organised 6<sup>th</sup> Biennial International Convention on "India on the Path to Sustainable and Inclusive Development: Myth or Reality" on 24 March, 2023 at Hotel Le Méridien, Delhi. The Keynote Speaker for the event was Mr. Labanya Prakash Jena, Commonwealth Regional Climate Finance Adviser, CW Secretariat. He stressed on the need for corporates to play a meaningful role in ensuring sustainable development.

The chief guest for the conference, Dr. Han Ulaş Demirag, Country Director, Head of South Hub, International Fund for Agricultural Development, shared his experience of working with the remote communities in India in Orissa, Madhya Pradesh and Uttarakhand. 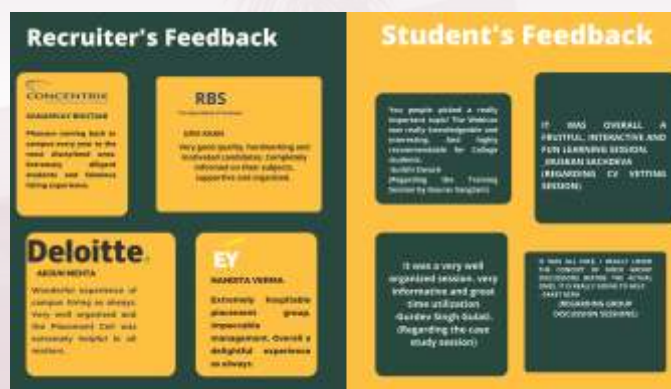
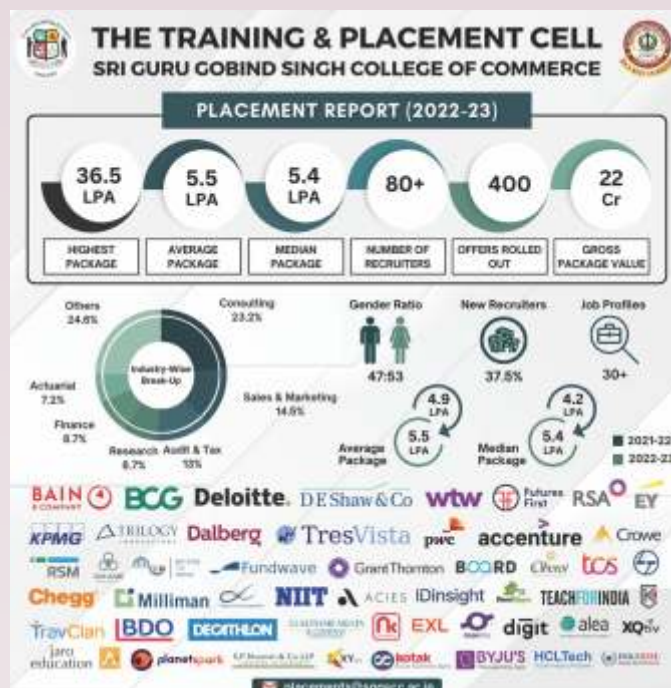
## Placement Cell

The Commerce Society of the college provides a platform for personality development of students. The society organizes Inter-College Academic Festival "RADIANCE" every year. The events include talent shows, debates, seminars, group-discussions, ad-mad shows and extempores. The students participate enthusiastically and actively in all the events for the integrated growth.

#### Arthshastra

The Economics Society 'Arthshastra', organises various events in the field of Economics. It organises its Annual Economic Festival 'Equilibria' which consists of group discussions, extempore, quiz, ad-mad-show and various debates. This provides a tremendous exposure to the students for their overall personality development.

#### ACE

ACE, Association of Computer Enthusiasts, includes students from B.Sc. (Hons.) Computer Science/B.Tech. The Society organizes various seminars and workshops for the intellectual and technical growth of the students. The society also organizes its annual departmental fest, 'COGNIZANCE', involving various computer science events like programming, LAN gaming, webpage making, etc.



## ASBEMS

The Association of Students of Business Economics and Management Studies (ASBEMS) organizes various inter-college academic and extra curricular activities like group discussions, debates, quizzes and extempore throughout the year to equip the students to face the career and corporate challenges ahead. An initiative 'Empathisers' is undertaken by the society to encourage students to stop using single use plastic and organize cleanliness drives and awareness campaigns for the same. The society also organizes its annual debating competition 'Vaktavya' and academic fest 'Confluence' every year which attracts students from all over the Delhi University and other universities too.

## Infinity– The Technology

The society is a consortium of tech mavericks that aims to ensure expertise necessary for the youth to become technically skilled and knowledgeable. The society created a 360° virtual tour of the entire college campus with the IQAC team. It received overwhelming feedback from the freshers and teachers. In August 2022, a new monthly series 'Retro Tech' was launched. It focused on current tech titans and their histories. ## Other Societies

### The Training and Placement Cell

This year, the highest package offered was 36.5 LPA by Trilogy Innovations, with 320+ students placed and 350+ offer letters received. The top companies that visited the college were Boston Consulting Group, EY, KPMG, PwC, Deloitte USI, WTW, Bain & Co., Oxane Partners, Trilogy Innovations. Profiles offered include Analyst, Consultant, Finance, Junior Knowledge Associate, Assurance, Audit, Marketing, Business Development, Administrative Assistant, Actuarial, Research, Subject Matter Expert, Operations, etc. The TPC conducted 12 sessions on various themes such as How to Build a Strong Resume, How to Crack Guesstimates, Aptitude Test, Group Discussion, One on One CV Vetting, Resume Building and CV Vetting, Leadership Talk on Audit Industry, Prep Strategy for MBA Entrance Exams, Email Etiquette, LinkedIn Profile Optimisation and Network, Cracking Off-campus Placements. Internship Fair, was a week-long event conducted in hybrid mode in the last week of March where in 60+ companies and 20+ profiles participated.





## Enactus

Enactus was established in 2012 and since then, has been constantly working towards improving the world through entrepreneurial action. With a team of sixty plus members, the society has been successful in impacting the lives through its several sustainable projects undertaken to tackle social and environmental challenges. "Amanat" and "Nivaran" are the two primary projects of the club. # General Requirements

- ◆ The applicant must be citizen of India.
- ◆ The applicant should have passed the Class XII examination of any Board/University examination in India or any foreign country recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- ◆ Applicants with gap year(s) will not be at any disadvantage for admission to undergraduate courses.

## Foreign Nationals

10% of Supernumerary seats in each program are reserved for Foreign Nationals. Candidates seeking admission under the Foreign Students' category are required to apply on Foreign Students' Registry website: <http://sr.du.ac.in>

Some Hostel Seats for the Female Foreign Nationals are reserved within the college premises and will be allotted on First cum First Serve Basis. However Male Foreign Nationals need to take up accommodation outside the college campus. Foreign Students are advised to adhere to the norms and values of the college and not indulge in smoking, drinking and consuming non-vegetarian food within the college premises.

## Sikh Minority Admission

Candidates from the Sikh minorities may also seek admission under the minority quota in the Minority Colleges of the University. All such candidates must appear in CUET 2023.

50% of the seats are reserved for the Sikh Minority Quota. Prospective Sikh students desirous of taking admissions to Undergraduate Courses of Delhi University under Sikh Minority Quota are required to seek Minority Certificate from Delhi Sikh Gurdwara Management Committee. They can apply either online or offline to DSGMC (<https://www.dsgmc.in/User/Index>) for this purpose. If they are seeking admissions under Minority Quota, they must apply under this category on University of Delhi Admission Portal.



## Supernumerary Seats

Admission to all supernumerary seats will through CUET 2023. Candidates desirous of taking admission on Supernumerary seats must appear in CUET 2023. They will be admitted as per the University of Delhi Guidelines.

- ◆ PH categories as notified by the Central Government.
- ◆ Concessional/Waiver of fees in respect of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PWBD) as notified by University of Delhi.

## Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) and Sports Admission Quota

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary quota for ECA and/or Sports must appear in CUET 2023/

For admissions to ECA and Sports supernumerary seats a weightage of 25% will be given to CUET score and 75% to certificates/trials/performances.

Further details shall be notified separately.

Depending on the availability/non-availability of sports person, the admission committee can alter the allocation of seats among games.

**Note :**

1. Students who are admitted on the basis of sports are required to attend practice regularly, failing which their admission is liable to be cancelled.
2. The candidates admitted on the basis of Sports will have to give an undertaking that they will actively participate in the sports events.

## Withdrawal of Admission

Withdrawal of Admission and refund of fees would be as per the rules and regulations laid down by the University.

## Attendance

In order to be eligible to appear at a university examination every student has to attend two third of the total number of lectures delivered at the college or the university in all subjects as also in tutorials/preceptorials/practicals as the case may be, taken separately in each semester. Attendance for tutorials/preceptorials will be given only when a student submits a written assignment. The students who join the course late will not be given any concession in the attendance. He/She is advised to be extremely regular to make up the deficiency because



of late admission. Name of those who remain continuously absent from classes for ten days without valid reason, shall be struck off the college rolls. Re-admission is not a matter of right. **The monthly attendance of the students will be notified on the website in the first week of subsequent month.**

Parents/guardians are requested to meet teachers of their wards periodically to know the progress of their wards, particularly with regard to punctuality in attending classes.

When a student is required to represent the college in competitive games, athletics, cultural activities, debates etc., sponsored by the college/university, he/she must apply for permission to the Principal in writing in advance.

## Internal Assessment

Students are regularly assessed on the basis of assignments, class test, projects etc. **It is mandatory for every student to preserve the assignments, class test answer sheets and soft copy of presentations. They would require to present them at the time of clearance/distribution of Admit Cards for examination.**

## Leave of Absence on Account of Sickness/Hospitalization

Application for leave of absence due to sickness/hospitalization must be supported by a Medical and Fitness Certificate (from a Registered Medical Practitioner) which should reach the college office within a week of the student rejoining the college. Medical and fitness certificates received thereafter, shall not be entertained. All leave applications must clearly have the class, roll number, name and subjects taken as well as the name of the teachers taking those subjects/papers. For availing benefits on attendance grounds, students should submit discharge report, prescriptions, radiologied tests, if any as well as a copy of the medicines bought during treatment.





## Identity Card

Every student of the college is issued an identity card which he/she is expected to carry with him/her at all times. He/she will have to produce the same, whenever required to do so.

## In Campus – Code of Conduct

As a student, Discipline is the observance of good conduct and breach of discipline includes:

- i) Irregularity in attendance, persistent idleness or negligence or indifference towards the work assigned.
  - ii) Causing disturbance to a Class or the Office or the Library or Sports.
  - iii) Misconduct or Misbehavior of any kind at the time of election to the students bodies or meeting or during curricular or extra-curricular activities.
  - iv) Misconduct or Misbehavior of any kind, towards a teacher or an employee of the college, University or another institution.
  - v) Causing damage to furniture or any other property of the college or any other institution of the university.
  - vi) \*Eve teasing and ragging in any form.
  - vii) \*Inciting others to do any of the acts aforesaid.
  - viii) Any misconduct inside and outside the college campus.
- ❑ Smoking is strictly prohibited in the College Premises which is no-smoking zone. Dr. Aradhana Nanda (Department of Economics) is the Anti Smoking Nodal Officer for the Year 2023-24.
  - ❑ The Proctorial Committee deals with the cases of indiscipline.
  - ❑ The Principal of the college has the right to take action whenever there is a breach of discipline.

## ORDINANCE XV-C OF THE UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

### \*Prohibition of and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which: (a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force; (b) violate the status, dignity and honour of women students; (c) violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribes; (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem; (e) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department of an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostels or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also *suo moto* enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3 (a), (b) and (c), the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
10. The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not, for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years, or that the results of the student concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared, be cancelled.
11. In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance, appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

## ORDINANCE XV-D OF THE UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

### \*Sexual Harassment

The present ordinance is based on the policy against sexual harassment by the Delhi University and seeks to maintain and create an academic and work environment free of sexual harassment for students, academics and non-teaching staff of Delhi University. The ordinance will also apply to outsiders and residents on the Delhi University campus to the extent specified in the University bulletin.
