

IQAC, with an objective to pursue quality enhancement and sustenance measures is making constant, consistent and catalytic improvement in the core activities and other related endeavors of the college. It has been working zealously to initiate and implement the broad objectives outlined under the purview of NAAC's four quadrant approaches i.e.

Infrastructural Growth, Empowering Students, Faculty and Non-Teaching Staff.

A process to create individual Faculty's Profile on the college website was initiated. Creation of Information Centre to collect details of all college events/societies was further improved. To empower students, Punjabi Language Remedial Classes were conducted for first year students. Domain-based E-mail IDs were created for each Society/Club/Department. Creation of Google Classroom for systematized data collection in IQAC Information Centre was further improvised. Digital ID Cards for Students, Faculty and Support Staff were created. IQAC along with the Head of Departments initiated the task of creating Question Banks for each subject/paper, for the benefit of the students and to facilitate their preparation for examination.

The IQAC in collaboration with the Research Committee, the Economics Department, and the Seminar Committee organized several seminars and workshops. One of them was on 'Smart e-Office Techniques 1.0 @2018: Stock Management and Data Handling Techniques' on 4th-5th June 2018. The aim was to impart technical skills to the Non-Teaching Staff and to equip them with key internet tools and enhance their soft skills.

BSE-SGGSCC- Centre of Excellence

Applied research is gaining importance in the present world especially – in the field of economics, finance, management and commerce. It requires knowledge of advanced statistical techniques and sophisticated software. The Research Committee was duly constituted in 2014 to promote and facilitate faculty members and students from different disciplines. The committee is now known/renamed as the BSE– "SGGSCC Centre of Excellence". Bearing in mind the dynamic nature of research, the Committee Centre has been continuously organizing Faculty Development Programmes and workshops/training sessions for students with competent resource persons from both within and outside the country.

SGGSCC- Centre for Professional Development

The centre aims at imparting competencies and fulfilling career aspirations of students through structured learning pathways i.e. offering add-on courses (Short term certificate/diploma courses), conducting training sessions/workshops, holding special lectures, etc. The centre promotes networking with national & international institutions of repute and collaborates with industry and academia for developing the curriculum and delivery of appropriate skills for students in tandem with the emerging needs of the society. Students are trained and updated by the professionals and also get an opportunity for experimental learning.

Courses of Study

Under Graduate Courses

B.Com. (Honours)

B.Com. (Hons.) is the flagship course of University of Delhi. This course seeks to enhance the knowledge base and practical skills in all the areas of business to enable the students to handle basic business tasks. The course also provides a strong foundation to pursue higher courses in business education. It is an integrated course which offers a competitive edge to the students in the wake of changing economic scenario. The course has been restructured in view of introduction of semester based examination scheme in all undergraduate courses of Delhi University. The revised syllabus has been designed keeping in view the requirements of trade and industry.

B.Com.

B. Com. programme is another prestigious and sought after course offered by Delhi University. It offers an indepth knowledge of all commerce subjects and equips one to take up many professional courses like M.B.A., C.A., C.S., I.C.W.A. etc. and academic courses like M.Com., B.Ed. etc. for further studies. The students looking for placement also get good job offers after completing the course. Certain new areas like 'Corporate Governance', 'Business Ethics and Corporate Social Responsibility', 'Business Environment', 'International Trade' etc. have been introduced in the syllabus to make the course market-oriented. The value addition in the course makes it go beyond the conventional areas and makes the degree contemporary with complete content.

B.A. (Honours) Economics

The college offers an under-graduate degree course in economics which is a highly prestigious and coveted course. This course offers a combination of scholastic and practical approach in the field of economic decision making and research and is a stepping stone for higher education in economics and other related areas. The course aims to provide the basic knowledge domain in order to meet the ever changing demands of our economic environment.

B.Sc. (Honours) Computer Science

The growth of the Indian IT industry has led to an increased demand for computer professionals. In the wake of rapid changes in technology, University of Delhi has restructured the B.I.T. course as B.Sc. (Hons.) in Computer Science. The course imparts the theoretical and programming skills to take up professional positions in the industry.

The course was introduced in our college in the year 2004-05. The students of B.Sc. (Hons.) Computer Science have been well placed in the professional IT organisations in the past years and have also been selected for higher studies in graded computer institutions through rigorous selection tests and interviews. A number of activities like industrial trips, workshops on practical implementation of computer hardware and digital equipments are organised by the department of computer science from time to time.

B.A. (Honours) Punjabi

The college has also introduced B.A. (Honours) Punjabi in the college with effect from academic session 2017-18. Admission to the course is based on cut off marks as per the criteria laid down by the University of Delhi. B.A. (Honours) Punjabi comprises of the study of literature, linguistics and philosophy of the Punjabi language. Subjects typically studied under this degree are Poetry, Drama, Fiction, Literary Criticism, Literary History etc.

B.A. (Honours) Business Economics (BBE)

The college has been running B.A. (Honours) Business Economics course since 1996. The demand for business economics has increased tremendously particularly in the corporate sector and research. A number of big industrial houses are employing business economists. B.A. (Honours) Business Economics is a course in applied economics. In order to sharpen essential skills in marketing and communication, the students undergo corporate summer training for about eight weeks, to get a better understanding of business environment and real organisational problems. A separate department (Department of Business Economics) has been entrusted with teaching and other responsibilities of the course. A number of facilities are provided including a computer lab, a modern library and seminar room.

The admission to this course on the basis of an Online Entrance Examination followed by an online allotment of course and college based on the merit and preference given by an applicant is conducted by the University of Delhi.

Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS)

Sri Guru Gobind Singh College of Commerce is a premier institute for B.A.(Hons.) Business Economics, which is an entrance based professional course. The college has already established its mark in the University for this course and to add yet another milestone to its journey of professional courses, Bachelor of Management Studies was introduced in the academic year 2017-18. To meet the growing demand for students proficiency in application based study, this course aims to equip the students with knowledge of management and its various dimensions that relate to business organisations with practical approach and industry exposure through interniship and training programmes. BMS is one of the first and finest undergraduate professional course in management study offered by University of Delhi. It holds distinction of providing students with unparalleled exposure to the real world.

The college offers 46 seats under the course and is affiliated to the Faculty of Applied Social Sciences and Humanities (FASSH), University of Delhi. The course has a well qualified faculty team with a unique blend and exposure of industry as well as academics and aims at developing students with effective human, technical and conceptual skills, along with comprehensive knowledge of the core functional areas of management like finance, marketing, human resource, financial modeling and applied econometrics. Students are encouraged for national and international internships along with live research projects on contemporary topics of finance, economics, marketing and international economics. A separate department (Department of Management Studies) has been commended to delegate teaching and learning process with the modern facilities of computer lab, library with huge data bases and seminar room.

Post-Graduate Courses

Post-Graduate Diploma in International Marketing (PGDIM)

Ours is the first college under Delhi University to run the PGDIM course. The programme structure, teaching methodology and industry interaction with focus on behaviourial skills and global orientation have been the key features of this course. The emphasis is on enhancing the understanding of the prevailing business environment for effective decision making. Besides lectures, an extensive use of case studies, management games and simulation exercises enable the students to acquire necessary skills expected of them.

Diploma in Business Journalism and Corporate Communication (DBJCC)

The one year, full time, Post Graduate Diploma Programme viz., Diploma in Business Journalism and Corporate Communication, is an innovative course which aims to impart the core contents of the Public Relations (PR), Advertising, Corporate Communication, Print and Electronic Media to the students. Our consistent endeavour is to provide quality education and practical training to the young aspirants with a view to channelise their youthful energy leading them towards excellent communication skills not only in the field of news, cyber journalism, mass media but also in public relations and image building in the corporate sector.

A separate prospectus is available for the above mentioned Diploma courses from the college Administration Office.

M.Com.

M. Com. is a prestigious post graduate course of Delhi University which aims to enhance academic and research level in our educational institutions on one hand and prepare aspiring entrepreneurs to handle their businesses on the other. This course is run by Department of Commerce, Faculty of Commerce and Business, Delhi University with the support of few affiliated colleges. In this regard our college also provides the support of the tutorial base, library and infrastructure facilities etc. for students enrolled here. Admission to this course is based on Centralised Admission Test conducted by Department of Commerce. Students have to register themselves at Arts Faculty and indicate their choice of college which is allocated by the Department strictly on the basis of merit.

Add-on Courses

Keeping pace with accelerating demand for career-oriented courses at undergraduate level, the college offers short term add-on courses in collaboration with organisations of repute. These courses aim at equipping students with tools to meet the challenges of highly competitive job market. These courses have been designed to bridge the gap between industry and academia. Students are not only trained and updated by the professionals but also get an opportunity for experiential learning.

Programme/Course-wise Requirement

B.A. (Hons.) Economics

As Per University of Delhi Admission Brochure 2019-2020

Specific Requirements: The merit shall be determined on the basis of one language, Mathematics and two best academic/elective subjects. (List A & B)

Procedure for Calculating Best of Four Subjects Percentage

- An aggregate of 60% marks or more in one Language from List A1, Mathematics and combination of best two other elective subjects from Lists A and B.
- Out of the best two chosen above, non-inclusion of Economics will lead to a deduction of 1% on the aggregate of the Best Four.
- Inclusion of any subject other than those given in Lists A and B in the best two will lead to a deduction of 2.5% per subject on the aggregate of the Best Four.

Note:

- 1. If an applicant does not include the subjects given in List A in Best Four, then a deduction of 2.5% of maximum marks will be levied for each subject for the purpose of calculating 'Best Four'.
- 2. All subjects to be included in the calculation of Best Four must have at least 70% Theory Component of Exam. In case, the subject to be considered does not have 70% Theory Component and 30% Practical Component, then the marks of the Theory and Practical only shall be converted to 70% and 30% respectively on Pro Rata basis. These new marks will then be considered for calculation of Best Four
- 3. The applicants must have studied and passed Mathematics at the Qualifying exam for admission to B.A. (Hons) in Economics.

Procedure for Calculating Best of Four Subjects Percentage

Selection shall be made on the basis of Marks Obtained in Qualifying Examination including One Language and Three Best Subjects as per the following:

- An aggregate of 60% or more in English/Hindi and combination of best three among the following subjects: Mathematics, Accountancy, Economics and Business Studies/Commerce.
- Inclusion of any subject other than mentioned above from List B in the combination of best three will lead to a deduction of 1% per subject on the aggregate, with a maximum net deduction of 2%.
- Inclusion of any subject other than List B in the combination of best three will lead to a deduction of 2.5% per subject on the aggregate of the Best Four.

Note:

- 1. All subjects to be included in the calculation of 'Best Four' must have at least 70% theory component of examination. In case the subject to be considered does not have at least 70% theory component, then the marks obtained in theory and practical shall be converted to 70% and 30% respectively, on pro rata basis. The marks so arrived at will then be considered for calculation of 'Best Four'.
- 2. The computation of 'best four' subjects in the above framework should lead to an effective and unique 'best four' which would be higher than any other combination of 'best four' subjects.

B.Com.

Procedure for Calculating Best of Four Subjects Percentage

Selection shall be made on the basis of Marks Obtained in Qualifying Examination including One Language and Three Best Subjects as per the university rules:

- An aggregate of 60% or more in English/Hindi and combination of best three among the following subjects: Mathematics, Accountancy, Economics and Business Studies/ Commerce.
- Inclusion of any subject other than mentioned above from List B in the combination of best three will lead to a deduction of 1% per subject on the aggregate, with a maximum net deduction of 2%.
- Inclusion of any subject other than List B in the combination of best three will lead to a deduction of 2.5% per subject on the aggregate of the Best Four.

Note:

- 1. All subjects to be included in the calculation of 'Best Four' must have at least 70% theory component of examination. In case the subject to be considered does not have at least 70% theory component, then the marks obtained in theory and practical shall be converted to 70% and 30% respectively, on pro rata basis. The marks so arrived at will then be considered for calculation of 'Best Four'.
- 2. The computation of 'best four' subjects in the above framework should lead to an effective and unique 'best four' which would be higher than any other combination of 'best four' subjects.

B.Sc. (Honours) Computer Science

For Admission a candidate should have secured:

- 60% or more Marks in Mathematics.
- An aggregate of 60% or more marks in English, Mathematics and best of the two subjects from Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science/Informatics Practices

OR

 An aggregate of 60% or more marks in English, Mathematics and two subjects (other than Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science/Informatics Practices) from List B with a deduction of 1% per subject in the aggregate.

B.A. (Honours) Punjabi

For Admission a candidate should have secured:

- 40% or more marks in Class X or Class XII in Punjabi.
- An aggregate of 45% or more marks in either English or any Indian language from List A and combination of best three other subjects from List A and List B.
- Inclusion of any subject(s) other than those given in List A and List B in the best three will lead to a deduction of 2.5% per subject on the aggregate of the Best Four.

B.A. (Hons.) Business Economics / Bachelors of Management Studies

Apart from the documents given in the check list on Page no. 16 as per university guidelines documents to be submitted at the time of admission are same except that additional evidence of rank in University Merit list should be produced at the time of admission. Online allocation slip generated through students portal containing rank is also required.

Procedure for Calculating Best of Four Subjects Percentage

- * Aggregate of 60% or more marks in the qualifying examination in four subjects: English, Mathematics and any two other subjects included in List B.
- * Selection will be based on the rank computed from the combined weighted average of percentage scored in the entrance test and the percentage scored in the qualifying examination where the weights are: Entrance Test: 65%, Qualifying Examination: 35%.
- * The entrance test will examine the following areas: Quantitative Ability Reasoning and Analytical Ability General English Business and General Awareness

- * An aggregate of 45% marks in the qualifying examination.
- * The merit shall be determined on the basis of one language and three best academic/elective subjects.
- * The applicants must have studied and passed Mathematics at the qualifying exam for admission to B.A. (Honours) in Economics.

B.Com. (Hons.)

- * An aggregate of 45% marks in the qualifying examination.
- * The applicant must have studied and passed Mathematics/Business Mathematics at the qualifying examination for admission to B. Com. (Hons.).
- * Selection shall be made on the basis of marks obtained in qualifying examination including one language and three best subjects as per the following:
- * An aggregate of 45% or more in English/Hindi and combination of best three among the following subjects: Mathematics, Accountancy, Economics and Business Studies/Commerce.
- * Inclusion of any subject from List B other than mentioned above in the combination of best three will lead to a deduction of 1% per subject on the aggregate.
- * Inclusion of any subject other than those in Lists A and B in the combination of best three will lead to a deduction of 2.5% per subject on the aggregate of the Best Four.

B.Com.

- * An aggregate of 40% marks in the qualifying examination.
- * Selection shall be made on the basis of marks obtained in qualifying examination including one language and three best subjects as per the following:

- * Inclusion of any subject from List B other than mentioned above in the combination of best three will lead to a deduction of 1% per subject on the aggregate.
- * Inclusion of any subject other than those in Lists A and B in the combination of best three will lead to a deduction of 2.5% per subject on the aggregate of the Best Four.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Computer Science

- * Mathematics, one language and two other subjects listed as academic subjects
- Should have secured
 - a) 60% or more marks in Mathematics
 - b) 60% or more marks in aggregate of four subjects including Mathematics, one language and two other subjects listed as Academic Subjects.
- * The admission would be based on the aggregate of marks scored in class XII in best four academic subjects inclusive of one language, Mathematics and two out of Physics, Chemistry and Computer Science/Informatics Practices.
- * The students from other streams, (with Mathematics in Class XII), will have a disadvantage of 2% in aggregate of required four subjects, i.e. Mathematics + one language + two academic subjects from those streams.

B.A. (Hons.) Punjabi

- * An aggregate of 45% marks in the qualifying examination.
- * Applicants securing 40% marks in the aggregate and 50% marks in the subject concerned are also eligible for admission to the relevant Honours Course.
- * The merit shall be determined on the basis of one language and three best academic/elective subjects.

- * For admission to Honours in any language course, advantage of 2% in the 'Best Four' percentage will be given to those applicants who have studied that particular elective language.
- * In case the applicant has not studied a language at qualifying exam and is seeking admission to Honours in that language, deduction of 5% will be imposed on 'Best Four' percentage.

Note

- * The University may define any other relevant subjects as academic/elective for a particular course.
- * In case an applicant has studied elective and core languages, the core/elective language subject will be treated as language, while elective language can be considered as academic/elective subject.
- * For the calculation of Best Four subjects percentage for Arts/Humanities honours courses, if the applicant includes subjects other than those given in Lists A and B, then a deduction of 2.5% of maximum marks will be levied for each such subject for the purpose of calculating 'Best Four'.
- * #Out of three academic/elective subjects chosen above, one must be the concerned subject in which the admission is sought, failing which a deduction of 2.5% will be imposed on the calculated 'Best Four' percentage.

Academic Resources & Infrastructural Facilities

Library

The college library is housed in a multi-storied, centrally air-conditioned wing. It has modern facilities such as microfilming section, reprographics section, a small computer center, an audio visual room etc. The college maintains a well-stocked library. The collection of the library at present consists of more than 37000 books, 50 bound volumes of important journals and about 250 CDs. We have a rich collection of books on Commerce, Economics, Mathematics, Computer Science, Management and Sikhism. The library regularly subscribes to about 25 newspapers, 50 journals and magazines (Indian as well as International) on a variety of subjects.

The college library acquired NETLIB library software in 2001. The database of the books has been created. Some of the library facilities such as cataloging, CAS, OPAC search has already been computerized. The library has online public access catalogue through a web browser. The library books can be searched through internet on college website www.sggscc.com/library or through web OPAC link http://sggscclibrary.saraswatilib.com. Entire database of the books can be searched through author, title, subject, etc. Patrons can view their transactions in the 'My account tab' of the window OPAC. User ID and password is the roll number of the student.

Classrooms

Our college has spacious, well-lit and well-ventilated audio-visual classrooms. There is a power back-up facility in case of power breaks down to make sure teaching is not affected by the same.

Reading room

A spacious and well equipped reading room is provided for the students that offers a quiet and peaceful environment for self learning. Around five hundred text books are available for ready reference in the same.

Computer Labs

The college hosts three ultra modern, centrally air-conditioned and well-furnished fully equipped computer labs to cater to the needs of Computer Science, Commerce and Economics students. It has two servers for Windows-NT and Linux multi-user operating systems each with 31 PC nodes equipped with Multimedia kits and interfaces to inkjet printers, laser printers and a scanner. The labs provide the internet facility accessible on each node.

The software profile includes the licensed versions of the latest packages viz., visual studio (Visual basic, Visual C++, Visual FoxPro), Jbuilder, Oracle, Tally, Dbase etc. as also the language compilers, viz, Turbo C++, Java Qbasic etc. We have established one electronic laboratory for B.Sc. (Computer Science) Students having 12 digital training kits for electronic practicals. We have added 40 more advanced systems to fulfill the needs of the college students.

Workshops and Lectures

It is important to mention that all the departments are very active and regular in organising several workshops, trainings and lectures. These activities are organised on relevant topics and experts in the respected areas are invited to enlighten the students. Topics of contemporary importance are chosen to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real world scenario.

Fine Arts Society (Virtuoso)



Rules/Academic Requirements

Foreign Students

All Foreign students are required to apply for admission through the Foreign Students' Advisor of the University of Delhi. No direct admission is made.

PH and Other Reserved Categories

Admission for Physically Handicapped/Kashmiri Migrants and Children of War Widows will be according to the University of Delhi Rules.

Procedure for Admission

Cut offs and detailed selection criteria of different courses for admission will be put on the college notice board. Students who meet the minimum cut-off percentage can meet the Convenor, Admission Committee for verification of their certificates. No individual intimation is sent to individual applicants. It is an applicant's responsibility to find out the date fixed for his/her admission and fee submission.

Candidates selected for admission are required to fill up the registration form and submit in the college. Admission to college is provisional and is subject to the final approval of the University on submission of University Enrolment form by the student. Students selected for admission will be required to:

- i) Produce the documents mentioned in the check list.
- ii) Fill and submit the College form.
- iii) Fill and submit the University Enrolment Form (To be obtained from the college).



- iv) Fill the identity Card form cum the data base form.
- v) Entry to the college will be permitted only on presenting the authenticated fee slip, till the student Identity Card is issued.

Students admitted to the college will be bound by the admission rules and regulations of the college and the University of Delhi. Students are expected to go through the rules regarding discipline and ragging before coming for admission by checking on the college *website www.sggscc.ac.in*. Further the students should consult the University of Delhi, Brochure of Information 2019-2020 for complete Ordinance on Maintenance of Discipline. (ug.du.ac.in/site_files/ug_Bulletin.pdf)

Withdrawal of Admission

Withdrawal of Admission and refund of fees would be as per the rules and regulations laid down by the University.

Sikh Minority Admission

The college is a Minority Educational Institute as declared by National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions (NCMEI). 50% of the seats are reserved for Sikh Minority Students in different courses offered in the college. Students seeking admission under Sikh Minority quota must posses Sikh Minority Certificate issued by Delhi Sikh Gurudwara Management Committee.

Sports/ECA Admission

We have special provision of admission for Sports achievers and performer in Extra Curricular activities. Only Giddha and Bhangra (Folk Dances of India), will be considered. The candidates wishing to apply under Sports/ECA quota must fill University registration form and upload their Sports/ECA certificates. Depending on the availability/non-availability of sports person, the admission committee can alter the allocation of seats among games.

Note:

- 1. Students who are admitted on the basis of sports are required to attend practice regularly, failing which their admission is liable to be cancelled.
- 2. Students admitted on the basis of extra-curricular activities are required to participate in such activities as are organized by the College from time to time, failing which their admission is liable to be cancelled.

The candidates admitted on the basis of ECA or Sports will have to give an undertaking that they will actively participate in the college functions/sports events.

Attendance

In order to be eligible to appear at a university examination every student has to attend two third of the total number of lectures delivered at the college or the university in all subjects as also in tutorials / preceptorials/ practicals as the case may be, taken separately in each semester. Attendance for tutorials / preceptorials will be given only when a student submits a written assignment. The students who join the course late will not be given any concession in the attendance. He/She is advised to be extremely regular to make up the deficiency because of late admission. Name of those who remain continuously absent from classes for ten days without valid reason, shall be struck off the college rolls. Re-admission is not a matter of right. The monthly attendance of the students will be notified on the website in the first week of subsequent month.

Parents / guardians are requested to meet teachers of their wards periodically to know the progress of their wards, particularly with regard to punctuality in attending classes.

When a student is required to represent the college in competitive games, athletics, cultural activities, debates etc., sponsored by the college/university, he/she must apply for permission to the Principal in writing in advance.

Internal Assessment

Students are regularly assessed on the basis of assignments, class test, projects etc. It is mandatory for every student to preserve the assignments, class test answer sheets and soft copy of presentations. They would require to present them at the time of clearance/distribution of Admit Cards for examination.

Leave of Absence on Account of Sickness/Hospitalization

Application for leave of absence due to sickness/hospitalization must be supported by a Medical and Fitness Certificate (from a Registered Medical Practitioner) which should reach the college office within a week of the student rejoining the college. Medical and fitness certificates received thereafter, shall not be entertained. All leave applications must clearly have the class, roll number, name and subjects taken as well as the name of the teachers taking those subjects/ papers. For availing benefits on attendance grounds, students should submit discharge report, prescriptions, radiologied tests, if any as well as a copy of the medicines bought during treatment.











Identity Card

Every student of the college is issued an identity card which he/she is expected to carry with him/her at all times. He/she will have to produce the same, whenever required to do so.

In Campus – Code of Conduct

As a student, Discipline is the observance of good conduct and breach of discipline includes:

- i) Irregularity in attendance, persistent idleness or negligence or indifference towards the work assigned.
- ii) Causing disturbance to a Class or the Office or the Library or Sports.
- iii) Misconduct or Misbehavior of any kind at the time of election to the students bodies or meeting or during curricular or extra-curricular activities.
- iv) Misconduct or Misbehavior of any kind, towards a teacher or an employee of the college, University or another institution.
- v) Causing damage to furniture or any other property of the college or any other institution of the university.
- vi) *Eve teasing and ragging in any form.
- vii) *Inciting others to do any of the acts aforesaid.
- viii) Any misconduct inside and outside the college campus.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited in the College Premises which is no-smoking zone. Dr. Aradhana Nanda (Department of Economics) is the Anti Smoking Nodal Officer for the Year 2019-20.
- The Proctorial Committee deals with the cases of indiscipline.
- The Principal of the college has the right to take action whenever there is a breach of discipline.

Student must visit the College Website www.sggscc.ac.in from time to time for important inputs placed periodically.

ORDINANCE XV-C OF THE UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

*Prohibition of and Punishment for Ragging

- 1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- 2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- 3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which: (a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force; (b) violate the status, dignity and honour of women students; (c) violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribes; (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem; (e) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
- 4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department of an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostels or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- 5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also *suo moto* enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- 6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- 7. If the Principal of College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
- 8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
- 9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3 (a), (b) and (c), the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
- 10. The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not, for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years, or that the results of the student concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared, be cancelled.
- 11. In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance, appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
- 12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging will also amount to ragging.
- 13. All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice- Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

ORDINANCE XV-D OF THE UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

*Sexual Harassment

The present ordinances is based on the policy against sexual harassment by the Delhi University and seeks to maintain and create an academic and work environment free of sexual harassment for students, academics and non-teaching staff of Delhi University. The ordinance will also apply to outsiders and residents on the Delhi University campus to the extent specified in the University bulletin.
