The college library is housed in a multi-storied, centrally air-conditioned wing.

- Library is fully integrated with RFID (Radio Frequency Identification Device) for self-check in/check out of books by users for saving the time of the users.
- More than 57092 books, 586 bound volumes (back volumes) of important journals and about 1055 CDs.
- Rich collection of books on Commerce, Economics, English, Punjabi, Hindi, Mathematics, Computer Science, Management, Environment Studies, Political Science, General Studies and Sikhism.

- The library regularly subscribes to about 20 newspapers, 32 journals and 18 magazines (Indian as well as foreign) on variety of subjects.
- Library being an active member of DELNET, provides access to various electronic resources to its users including access to DULS e-resources through website crl.du.ac.in or DU eLibrary app. These e-resources are accessible locally within the campus as well as remotely from anywhere.
- The entire library collection can also be searched through Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). It can be searched through web OPAC link <http://sggscclibrary.saraswatilib.com> and through QR code. The user may access their library account and search the OPAC from anywhere and anytime through mobile phone, laptop, desktop etc. using the login credentials of the student (Roll No.).

COMPUTER LAB

The college hosts four ultra modern, centrally air- conditioned and well-furnished fully equipped computer labs to cater to the needs of Computer Science, Commerce and Economics students. It has two servers for Windows-NT and Linux multi-user operating systems each with 31 PC nodes equipped with Multimedia kits and interfaces to inkjet printers, laser printers and a scanner. The labs provide the internet facility accessible on each node. The software profile includes the licensed versions of the latest packages viz., visual studio (Visual basic, Visual4 pic C++, Visual FoxPro), Jbuilder, Oracle, Tally, Dbase etc. as also the language compilers, viz, Turbo C++, Java Qbasic etc. We have established one electronic laboratory for B.Sc. (Hons.) Computer Science. We have added 40 more advanced systems to fulfill the needs of the college students.

PROCESS

Foreign Nationals

10% of Supernumerary seats in each program are reserved for Foreign Nationals. Candidates seeking admission under the Foreign Students' category are required to apply on Foreign Students' Registry website: <http://fsr.du.ac.in> Some Hostel Seats for the Female Foreign Nationals are reserved within the college premises and will be allotted on First come First Serve Basis. However Male Foreign Nationals need to take up accommodation outside the college campus. Foreign Students are advised to adhere to the norms and values of the college and not indulge in smoking, drinking and consuming non-vegetarian food within the college premises.

Sikh Minority Admission

Candidates from the Sikh minorities may also seek admission under the minority quota in the Minority Colleges of the University. OTHER

Attendance

In order to be eligible to appear at a university examination every student has to attend two third of the total number of lectures delivered at the college or the university in all subjects as also in tutorials/preceptorials/ practicals as the case may be, taken separately in each semester. Attendance for tutorials/preceptorials will be given only when a student submits a written assignment. The students who join the course late will not be given any concession in the attendance. He/She is advised to be extremely regular to make up the deficiency because of late admission. Name of those who remain continuously absent from classes for ten days without valid reason, shall be struck off the college rolls. Re-admission is not a matter of right. The monthly attendance of the students will be notified on the website in the first week of subsequent month.

Parents/guardians are requested to meet teachers of their wards periodically to know the progress of their wards, particularly with regard to punctuality in attending classes.

When a student is required to represent the college in competitive games, athletics, cultural activities, debates etc., sponsored by the college/ university, he/ she must apply for permission to the Principal in writing in advance.

INFORMATION

Internal Assessment

Students are regularly assessed on the basis of assignments, class test, projects etc. It is mandatory for every student to preserve the assignments, class test answer sheets and soft copy of presentations. They would require to present them at the time of clearance/ distribution of Admit Cards for examination.

Leave of Absence on Account of Sickness / Hospitalization

Application for leave of absence due to sickness/hospitalization must be supported by a Medical and Fitness Certificate (from a Registered Medical Practitioner) which should reach the college office within a week of the student rejoining the college. Medical and fitness certificates received thereafter, shall not be entertained. All leave applications must clearly have the class, roll number, name and subjects taken as well as the name of the teachers taking those subjects/ papers. For availing benefits on attendance grounds, students should submit discharge report, prescriptions, radiologied tests, if any as well as a copy of the medicines bought during treatment.

Identity Card

Every student of the college is issued an identity card which he/ she is expected to carry with him/her at all times. He/ she will have to produce the same, whenever required to do so.

IMPORTANT RULES

In Campus - Code of Conduct

- As a student, Discipline is the observance of good conduct and breach of discipline includes:
 - i. Irregularity in attendance, persistent idleness or negligence or indifference towards the work assigned.
 - ii. Causing disturbance to a Class or the Office or the Library or Sports.
 - iii. Misconduct or Misbehavior of any kind at the time of election to the students bodies or meeting or during curricular or extra-curricular activities.
 - iv. Misconduct or Misbehavior of any kind, towards a teacher or an employee of the college, University or another institution.
 - v. Causing damage to furniture or any other property of the college or any other institution of the university.
 - vi. *Eve teasing and ragging in any form.
 - vii. *Inciting others to do any of the acts aforesaid.
 - viii. Any misconduct inside and outside the college campus.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited in the College Premises which is no-smoking zone. Dr. Meenu Gupta (Department of Commerce) is the Anti Smoking Nodal Officer for the Year 2025-26.
- The Proctorial Committee deals with the cases of indiscipline.
- The Principal of the college has the right to take action whenever there is a breach of discipline.

ORDINANCE XV-D

Sexual Harassment

The present ordinance is based on the policy against sexual harassment by the Delhi University and seeks to maintain and create an academic and work environment free of sexual harassment for students, academics and non-teaching staff of Delhi University. The ordinance will also apply to outsiders and residents on the Delhi University campus to the extent specified in the University bulletin.



IMPORTANT RULES

ORDINANCE XV-C

Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College / Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which
 - a. Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force.
 - b. Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students.
 - c. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe.
 - d. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
 - e. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suomoto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Principal/ Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/ she may so advise the Principal/ Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Principal/ Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his / her decision shall be final.

9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Principal/ Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
10. The Vice-chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of the University of Delhi are found guilty; under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All Institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions / directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

Note: Order of the Vice-Chancellor in pursuance of Ordinance XV-C: Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority under this Ordinance, the students(s) involved in ragging, shall be expelled for a specified term, designated in the order. Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

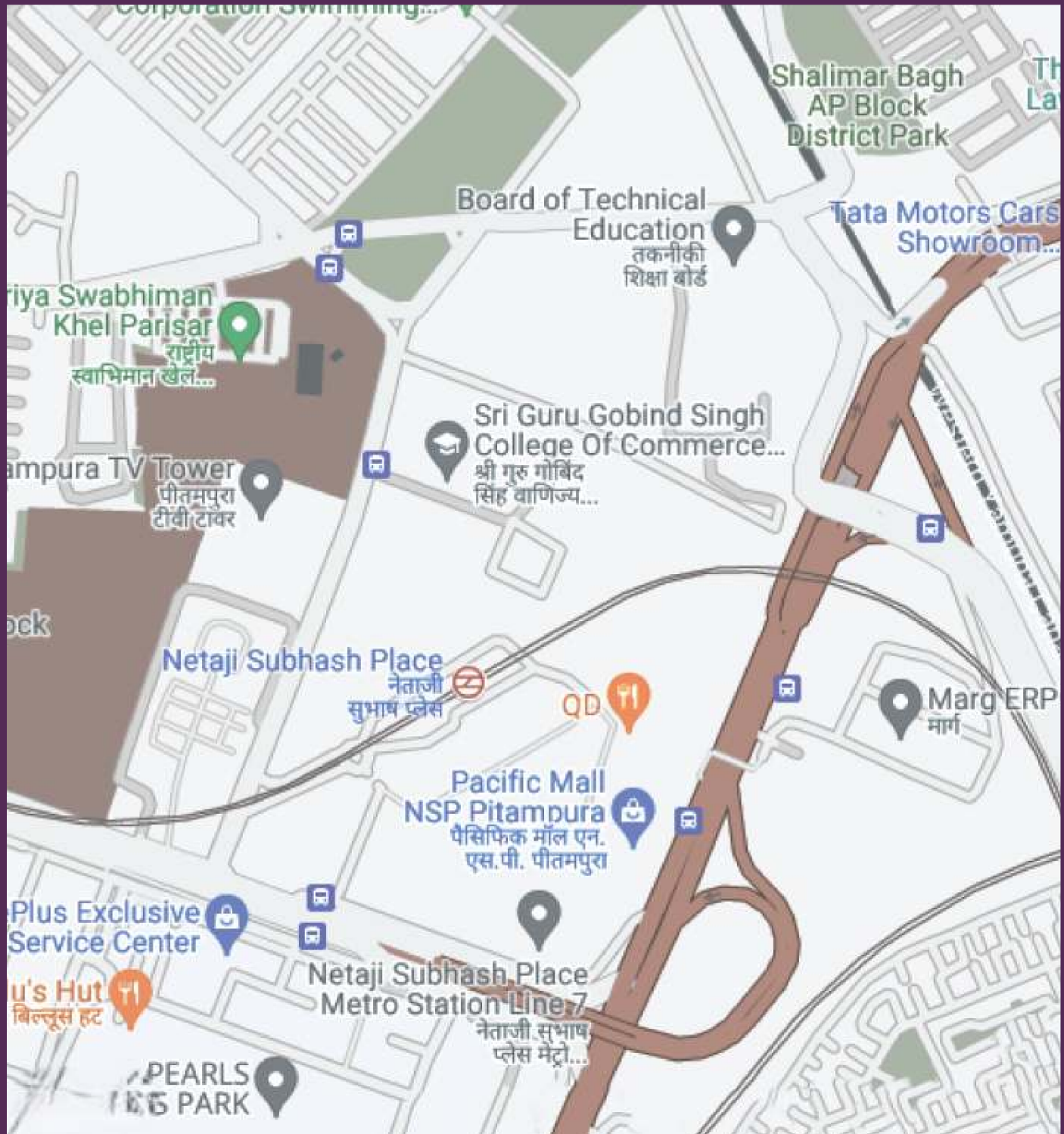
